KCC's curriculum will fulfill the general education requirements toward transfer and introduce students to the field of Law Enforcement. Students work with an academic planning advisor to create an individualized program that will meet the requirements for completion of the Associate in Applied Science in Law Enforcement during the first and last year of their program and that the courses taken at WMU in the middle of the program will meet the WMU requirements for the BA in University Studies. Students must take at least 9 credit hours of 3000 level or above criminal justice courses offered by the WMU Department of Sociology to complete the emphasis in criminal justice. These include SOC 3620, SOC 3630, SOC 3650, SOC 4120, SOC 4440, SOC 4440, SOC 4540, and SOC 4950 Drugs & Society. This list is subject to change as the Department of Sociology may change, add, or delete criminal justice courses from its online offerings. KCC's curriculum includes general and subject area courses, professional preparation, and knowledge and experience to apply Law Enforcement work and the Police Academy.

With successful completion of the Associate in Applied Science in Law Enforcement, students meet state requirements for MCOLES Certification upon being hired for work with a Law Enforcement agency within one year following completion of the Police Academy.

It is recommended that potential applicants meet with an advisor every semester to review degree requirements, course schedule, and to address any questions they may have.
