




Some information, such as name, address, birth date, degrees earned, etc., are classified as public directory information

Prerequisites & Requisites: (1) ACCUPLACER® reading score of 60, or at least a grade of C in TSRE 55 (AND) (2) ACCUPLACER® sentence skills score of at least 55, or TSEN 65 with at least a grade of C.




When you are ready to print a page, program, or course from the catalog, click on the print icon and a print friendly page will open then you can choose to print the page.
